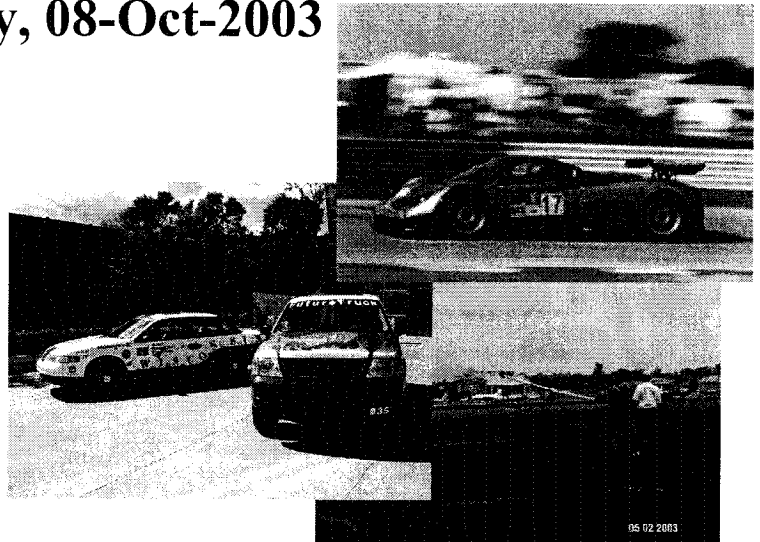

American Viperacing, previously a two car, Dodge Viper GTSR team competing in the full American Le Mans Series for the past two seasons, is back for the 2003 ALMS campaign with several changes.

The team runs Viper GTSR's and the new Pagani Zonda. The Zonda, powered by a Mercedes V12, made its world debut at the 51st running of the famed 12 hours of Sebring, March 15, 2003.

The Zonda, developed and manufactured at the Pagani factory in Modena, Italy by Carsport Modena, which is the new company formed by Toine Hezemans, Tom Weickardt, and Paul Kumpen, which has exclusive rights for the Pagani Zonda race car.

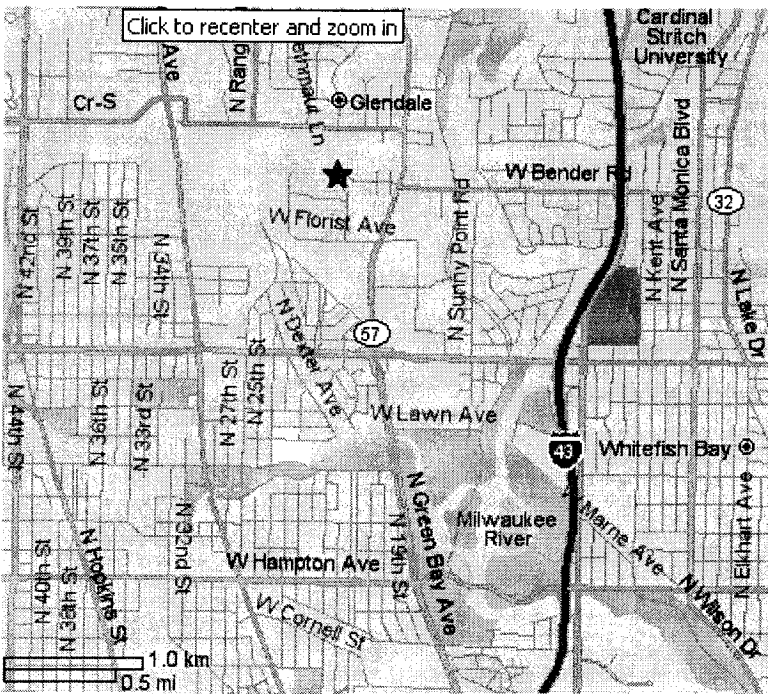

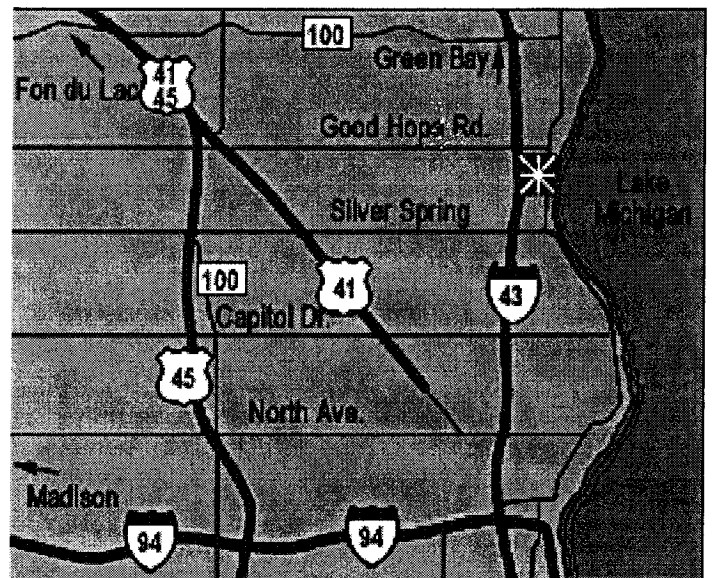
