Topics: The History of Discovery World and the New Facility / AWIM

Speakers: <> Paul Krajniak, Executive Director of Discovery World

Liz Sutton, Community Education Coordinator of Discovery World

Paul, a Milwaukee native, has championed the James Lovell Museum of Science, Economics and Technology's mission through the development of innovative educational experiences in science, technology, engineering and entrepreneurship. His tenure with the museum began in 1984, serving many of those years as director of exhibits and program development. Before joining Discovery World, Krajniak studied under educational psychology expert Dr. Raymond Wlodkowski, PhD., author of *Motivation and Teaching* and *Eager to Learn*. He has an extensive history of public service as a municipal arts board administrator, artist, and educator and today provides curriculum and project management oversight for all museum programs and activities.

His work with Discovery World has been recognized by ID Magazine and by NBC's *Today Show*, which named Discovery World as one of the Top Five Interactive Museums in the country. Exhibit Builder Magazine, the Association of Science and Technology Centers, the Village Voice and the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel have also recognized his efforts. He has collaborated with internationally acclaimed artists such as Meredith Monk, Ping Chong and music producer Todd Rundgren as well as coordinating 36 spots on the Captain Kangaroo Show. In 1999 Krajniak became the first outside artist to design exhibit space at the Walker Art Center in Minneapolis, MN. The 10,000 square foot exhibit displayed a retrospective on Meredith Monk, Bill T. Jones and Merce Cunningham.

Liz earned her B.S. in Education from UW-Stevens Point, and is certified 1-8 elementary education and 1-9 environmental education. She serves as an Educator at DW, worked with *AWIM* over the past year. Liz has taught at various levels in Southeastern Wisconsin, and began with DW last summer, teaching summer day camps. In August 2003, she began full time work in her current position.

She will be discussing AWIM, part of the SAE Foundation, the program at Discovery World, to include professional development, use of the program in classrooms, and how SAE members can get involved.

#### **Driving Directions:**

From Green Bay (I-43 South)

Exit at Wells/Civic Center exit, veer left onto Wells. Go four blocks east, passing James Lovell St to 6<sup>th</sup> St. Turn left onto 6<sup>th</sup>, left again onto State. Go one block west and turn left onto N. James Lovell St. DW is located just south of State.

From Madison (I-94 East)

Follow I-94 towards I-794, exit at Civic Center/J. Lovell exit (first exit on I-794). At the bottom of the off-ramp, follow the road curving left onto N. James Lovell St. Take N. James Lovell north, turn right onto Wells Street. Merge left immediately, turn left onto 6th. Turn left again onto State Street then one more left onto N. James Lovell. DW is located just south of State.

From Chicago (I-94 West)


Follow I-94 West to I-43 North (Green Bay). Follow I-43 N only briefly and exit at the Civic Center/Kilbourn Avenue exit (through tunnel). Turn left on 6th St and turn left on State St, then go one block west to N. James Lovell, turning left onto N. James Lovell Street. Discovery World is located just south of State Street.

To assist in our new initiatives, our Board will also be forming sub-committees. We welcome your desire to help us serve. Please inform any Board member of your interest


MSOE Student Awards given out by Dr. John, who recognized the following Student Members:






