SAE BOARD MEETING MINUTES



The SAE Milwaukee Section Board meeting was held on **September 22, 2011** at the Briggs & Stratton Engine Application Center, 3300 N. 124th Street, Wauwatosa, WI from 5:30 to 8:00 PM.

Chairman's Input:

- Jim introduced our guest, Diane McGuire, to the members of the SAE Milwaukee Section Board. Thank you Diane for attending the Milwaukee Section Board meeting and the Milwaukee Section Program at Erik Buell Racing. You have a standing invitation to attend our Section or Board meetings at any time.
- Jim reviewed the basics of the SAE insurance & liquor policy. The person to contact at SAE International if you have questions about an event is Jill Porter, Manager, HR Benefits & Risk Management (724-772-7119). Some of the highlights of the policy are as follows:
 - The comprehensive general liability for the Sections, Groups and Chapters provides coverage for the normal activities of the organization, including the liability incurred by the use of a meeting hall or other facility.
 - Additional coverage extends to many special events held by the Sections and Chapters, however, it is very important that SAE be notified of any events at least two weeks in advance.
 - The coverage extended to the Sections/Groups/Chapters provides coverage for loss from claims made or action brought against SAE and its Section/Group/Chapter as a result of injury or damage resulting from negligence, or for which the organization is found liable.

- Included named insurers are SAE, the Sections and/or chapters, their employees and their members and committee members while acting for or on behalf of the organization.
- Athletic events such as golf outings or softball games are covered. However, events involving motor sports use, athletic facilities, competitive events, or social events involving the serving of alcoholic beverages, require special coverage.
- Please note that this coverage is strictly limited and does not allow for the sale of liquor, even for charitable purposes, nor does it cover any organization or event that holds or is required to hold a liquor license.
- Section Officers should review the Liquor Policy for SAE Sections each year and submit their signed acknowledgement each year by August 31.
- It is imperative that Sections, Groups and Collegiate Chapters inform SAE headquarters of all activities outside the usual monthly dinner meetings to be certain the society is not being exposed to unnecessary risk.
- Both SAE Sections (including Groups and Divisions) and SAE International can be held liable if a Section hosts an event where alcohol purchased by the Section is served.
- Therefore, all Section activities where alcohol is served must be at the individual member's expense or paid for by a sponsor.
- Under no circumstances should alcohol ever be available through "self-serve."

Treasure's Report:

Frank provided a brief update for the group. Frank went over the year-end reports with the Board. The reports are due 12/31/11.

Discussion with Diane – Ideas...

- Best practices from other sections Diane talked about the Texas and Rockford / Beloit sections 5-yr. plan and how it was working for them. She talked about how the Oregon section was working with Freightliner Corporation on the company rep program. This helped by keeping up renewals in the section. She also talked about a possible 1 hour call-in for the company reps to discuss Best Practices.
- Promotional items for SAE membership (handouts, pens, etc.) Diane talked about some of the things that were available such as pens, handouts, cup, etc. Diane will send some samples to me to make available to the Board members for distribution. She recommended certificates for all Board members for their service.
- What are some SAE international resources that we are not using Diane mentioned using the SAE Exchange as a good source to acquire and store information, make the SAE Exchange info accessible to all the board members, use WebEx or NetMeeting instead of the monthly Board

meeting. She recommended having the board members on the leadership team.

- Ideas for university involvement Diane talked a little about the SAE Foundation and what it does to promote Science and Math. She also mentioned that to get the university students involved do more networking between the section, the faculty and the students.
- Year-end reports (new formats, improvements) Diane informed the Board members that the new summary reports are now all-in-one for the year-end review. The new reports are due once a year to make it easier on the sections. The new reports are also a guide to manage the section and for IRS audit verification. If we encountered a problem with the SAE website she recommended calling 800-TEAM SAE or e-mailing <u>CustomerService@SAE.org</u>.
- We brought up the problem of having to deal with so many returned monthly newsletters which are costing the Section a significant amount of money for postage. She recommended sending the mailing list to her for clean-up and to make sure the list is up to date.
- The Section Officer Leadership Seminars (SOLS) will be held in Chicago the 3rd week of June 2012. Two members will attend next year.

Diane provided the Board with a number of ideas on travel, student and regular memberships, Engineer Exchange, year-end reports, user friendly websites, insurance, promotional items and how other Sections conduct business. It would have been nice if we had more time to discuss these issues in more depth with her. The time seemed like it went by too fast.
