

SAE Milwaukee Section Board Member Spotlight

Mike Krauski – Collegiate Relations

Mike is currently employed as the Director of Corporate Relations at the University of Wisconsin- Milwaukee, College of Engineering & Applied Science. In that role Mike is responsible for managing collaborative relationships between industry and the College. Such collaborative relationships increase the competitiveness and profitability of industry through the offering of resources and services in the areas of: faculty research, student research, student internships, collaborative research centers, laboratory facilities, and research equipment. Mike also manages the College's ANSYS Institute for Industrial Innovation. Mike's work activities in the college of engineering make him a natural fit for the position of Collegiate Relations on the SAE-Milwaukee Section Board of Directors.



Mike's interest in SAE began in 1974 when he was working as a structural engineer at Bucyrus-Erie Company (now known as Caterpillar Global Mining). Being in the mining equipment industry, Mike's focus in SAE was with the Off-Highway Division. He attended many of the SAE Off-Highway conferences and trade shows that were held in the Milwaukee area at the time and through this participation learned to appreciate what SAE had to offer in terms of technical information on engineering innovative products. During the 1980's and 1990's Mike worked as a sales engineer selling finite element software and related engineering consulting services to a variety of Midwestern companies, including the Big-3 automotive companies in Detroit. It was during that time that Mike transitioned his SAE interests toward automotive engineering. He attended SAE meetings and conferences in the Detroit area and spoke as an invited speaker on the topic of finite element technology at a SAE-Detroit Section meeting.

Mike joined the SAE-Milwaukee Section in 1998, and became a member of the board a few years later. In Mike's role on the board he provides oversight to the organization of the annual SAE-Milwaukee Collegiate Student Night meeting. Throughout the year Mike regularly attends section and board of directors meetings. Mike's participation at the board meetings typically consists of providing advice and guidance on business matters under consideration by the board. In addition, from time to time Mike takes on the role of program manager for organizing and coordinating a section meeting involving a company tour.

If you are a regular reader of the section newsletter you are likely aware that the section has a "Shadow Board Member" program that allows interested non-board members of the section to become involved in learning more about the activities and duties of board members. Mike encourages all section members who have not served on the board to consider doing so through the Shadow Board Member program. SAE Milwaukee STEM/AWIM program
